Rebuilding the Infrastructure of Hockey in Canada

Lowe's Home Improvement, in partnership with Hockey Canada, announced its commitment to refurbishing ice rinks that are in dire need of repair. The new initiative benefits the many minor hockey teams in Lowe's store communities and encourages participation from municipalities, Lowe's employees and partners alike. Over the next five years, Lowe's will invest more than \$500,000 in grant money to refurbish two rinks in need per year. In order to maximize funding dollars and provide employees with the opportunity to get involved in the projects, the grants will be allocated towards rinks in communities where Lowe's stores are present.

"Hockey Canada is very excited to be launching this program and partnership with Lowe's," said Bob Nicholson, Hockey Canada president and CEO. "Over the past couple years, we identified the lack of good hockey facilities as a very big obstacle to hockey participation. With Lowe's leadership, this program will ensure that more young Canadians get to play the great game of hockey in quality rinks."

The 2010/11 season will see grants directed to the Vaughan Maple Lions Arena, built in 1974 and last updated in 1988, and Frank McCool Arena in Calgary, which has not been upgraded in 44 years. Repairs will vary by arena, but the work will include refurbishments to the dressing rooms and spectator benches, upgrades to lighting in dimly lit facilities and siding on building exteriors. In addition to the grant money, donations from vendor partners, along with volunteer hours from members of the community and Lowe's employees, will significantly increase the initial financial investment. Hockey Canada, with its deep connection to grassroots hockey and dedication to growing Canada's game, will work with Lowe's to help identify the arenas needing refurbishments the most.

OHF Announces Host Centres for Championships

The OHF minor hockey Championships will take place April 8 – 11, 2011 and will include division Champions from the Alliance, GTHL, NOHA and the OMHA along with the host team competing for the branch championship title. The road to the OHF Championships is not an easy one. Captains who have won gold medals have shared with the OHF some of the following tips and superstitions for being successful at the Championships. These include: team meetings, banana before each game, play keep up as a team warm up, a team song/chant, sit in the same spots in the dressing room and to always congratulate opponents on their efforts – win or lose!

The OHF will host the 2011 All-Ontario PeeWee AAA Championship and the Central Region Midget AAA Championship. Both these events are a week long and involve serious commitment by both teams and families. The All-Ontario PeeWee AAA Championship will take place March 28 - April 2, 2011 hosted by the Mississauga Reps Hockey Club. The Central Region Midget AAA Championship will take place March 28 - April 3, 2011 in London, Ontario. The winner of the regional championship will continue on to the National TELUS Midget AAA Championship which will be held at Mile One Centre in St. John's N.L. from April 18 – 24, 2011. In April 2010, the Mississauga Reps traveled to Levis, QC to represent the Central Region at the TELUS Cup where they earned the silver medal.

MHL Launches Program Geared Toward New Families

On Saturday, October 23rd, the Mississauga Hockey League took a significant step towards ensuring that enrollment in minor hockey in Mississauga continues to grow for the foreseeable future. With the launch of the Tim Hortons Got Hockey Program, the MHL was able to provide an opportunity for 120 children to attempt ice hockey for the first time.

Geared towards New Canadian families and first time hockey players, the Tim Hortons Got Hockey program was created with the goal of eliminating any potential cultural or financial barriers that are preventing the growth of hockey in Mississauga. With a fee of only \$35/participant, each player will receive 8 weeks of on-ice training and a thorough introduction to our National Pastime. Most importantly, the MHL will provide all necessary equipment during the program including: skates, gloves, helmets, sticks, elbow pads, and shin pads.

"We view this as a very exciting and important new program that will help ensure the continued growth of hockey in Mississauga" stated MHL President John Dolanjski. "By connecting with new families in our communities and providing them with this unique opportunity, it will help us in generating a fresh wave of hockey fans and players throughout Mississauga. Most importantly, we cannot express enough appreciation to the Ontario Trillium Foundation, Tim Hortons, and the NHLPA for their support and contributions towards the launch of this program."

The program will operate out of Malton Arena and Mississauga Valleys Arena and will run every Saturday through mid-December. All initial costs including ice rental, equipment, and training are being covered via a two-year \$65,200 grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation along with a significant donation of 40 complete sets of brand new hockey equipment from the National Hockey League Players' Association (NHLPA) Goals & Dreams fund.

"In addition to helping youth remain active and healthy, participation in community-based hockey is a great way to become engaged in community life, learn more about our neighbours and to teach Ontarians of all ages and backgrounds the value of team play," said Dr. Kuldip Kular, MPP for Bramalea-Gore-Malton.

The MHL is also thrilled to have added Tim Hortons as Title Sponsor of the program. Their support and assistance will not only help to ensure the program is offered on an annual basis, but will also allow the MHL to look at expanding the number of facilities involved throughout Mississauga.

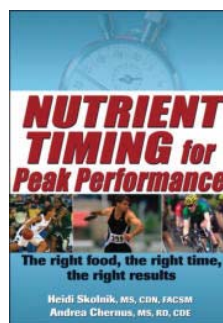

ALLIANCE Hockey Impact Testing Pilot Project

ALLIANCE Hockey in partnership with the Ontario Hockey Federation is conducting a Pilot Project with their Minor Peewee and Major Peewee Minor Development teams. The Pilot Project will involve a baseline test (ImPACT) at the start of the hockey season. This test is a web-based program and will be completed by the participant. Once this test is completed it can be used by a doctor who can then determine when that participant should return to play following a concussion based on this initial test and further testing.

ALLIANCE Hockey and the Ontario Hockey Federation are committed to providing a safe environment for all their participants and appreciate the leadership of the Hamilton Hub League, Waterloo Minor Hockey Association, Cambridge Minor Hockey Association, Burlington Lions Optimist Minor Hockey Association and St. Catharines CYO for taking part in this worthwhile program. For those participants who wish to access the test go to www.sportconcussions.com. To date over 240 participants have registered their baseline test which is approximately 92% compliance in completing the testing.

ImPACT (Immediate Post-Concussion Assessment and Cognitive Testing) was developed in the early 1990's by Dr. Mark Lovell and Joseph Maroon. The twenty minute test allows for a more objective assessment of concussion and recovery accounting for individual differences in cognitive ability and symptom reporting through the use of baseline testing.

Catch some International Hockey over the Holidays

For a team tour in the OHF or abroad to be approved, a specific tour application process must take place. Teams must work with their respective OHF member partner to collect the required documentation to be submitted to the branch office in a timely fashion. Hockey Canada will provide the final sanction approval for all incoming and outgoing tours. It is highly recommended that teams interested in traveling overseas contact a tour operator to assist with the process. OHL Awards 363 Academic Scholarships

The Ontario Hockey League has announced that a record 363 players have been awarded Academic Scholarships for the 2010-11 year. This represents the highest number of players to ever receive an OHL Scholarship, showing an increase of eight players from the previous record of 355 set last year. This season, 144 of the scholarships have been awarded to student athletes that are currently playing in the league, with another 219 scholarships awarded to graduated players that are enrolled in 66 different post-secondary institutions across North America. Of the 219 graduate players, 155 are currently playing Canadian Interuniversity Sport hockey for 24 different school teams.

"The OHL is very proud of the record success of the OHL Scholarship Program that continues to benefit so many of our student athletes," said OHL Commissioner David Branch. "The OHL continues to be a leading supplier of talent to both the National Hockey League and Canadian Interuniversity Sport by offering players the best of both worlds when it comes to hockey and academic goals."



For the second straight season the University of Guelph leads the way with 29 OHL Academic Scholarship recipients followed by the University of Western Ontario with 24, and Brock University with 21 OHL players enrolled. Leaders in CIS hockey include the Western Mustangs who have 13 OHL Scholarship recipients ahead of the Windsor Lancers

who have 12 former OHL players on scholarship, and both the Guelph Gryphons and Wilfrid Laurier Golden Hawks who each have 11 OHL graduates. The OHL Scholarship Program is funded by the member Clubs of the OHL.
