The Ontario Hockey League (OHL) is a proud member of the Canadian Hockey League (CHL) which is the world's largest development hockey league with 60 teams in nine Canadian provinces and four American states. The CHL is the number one development league for USPORTS, Canada's National Amateur Teams (U-17, U-18, U-20 WJC) and the NHL.

Founded in 1934, the OHL is comprised of 20 teams: 17 in Ontario, two in Michigan, and one in Pennsylvania.

In 15 of the 17 Ontario Communities where we play, the OHL team is the most popular sports or entertainment property.





CHL Scholarship Program

- The hallmark of the player experience in the OHL is our Scholarship Program
- This provides those players who have completed their time in the OHL a minimum of one year tuition, books and compulsory fees at a recognized university, college, trade school or career enhancing program for each year played in the league.
- Two stipulations that void education contract:
 - Signing an NHL Contract
 - Not accessing as a full-time student within 18months
- The program further provides that teams will pay for post-secondary tuition, books, and compulsory fees for players while playing in the league.


Support to the Ontario System

- OHL Performance Development League






